How you can use *Jessie & Friends* to help keep your child safer online

Before you watch *Jessie & Friends* with your child, here are a few things you can do:

- Explore together. Ask your child to show you their favourite websites and apps and what
 they do on them. Listen and show interest and encourage them to teach you the basics of
 the site or ann.
- Initiate (and continue) conversations about online safety. Ask them if anything ever bothers
 or worries them while they're online. You could use examples of events from the
 animations and ask if they've experienced anything similar. Reinforce the key message: if
 anything happens online which makes them feel worried, scared or sad, the best thing to
 do is talk to you or another adult who they trust.
- Help your child identify adults who can help: Help your child identify trusted adults from different areas of their life such as at home or at school.
- Be non-judgemental: Explain that you would never blame them for anything that migh happen online, and you will always give them calm and loving support.
- Supervise your child while they're online: Keep the devices your child uses in communal
 areas of the house such as in the living room or kitchen where an appropriate adult is able
 to supervise. It is not safe for a "-year olds to access the internet unsupervised in private
 spaces, such as alone in a bedroom or hatrixom."
- spaces, such as alone in a bedroom or bathroom.
