### Thankfulness

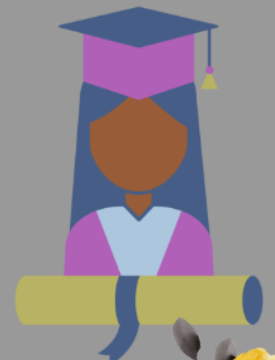
Gratitude is a special gift given to us by God. Gratitude is fundamentally about not taking things for granted. It is being thankful for what we have and receive. Gratitude

We started our week by being detectives. We were given lots of different clues to predict the theme of our new class reader which is 'Wolf Wilder' by Katherine Rundell.

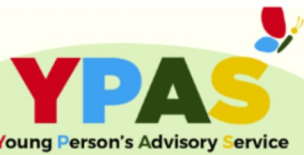
In Maths, we have started our place value topic. We have been using place value maths and counters to support us with understanding the value of eight digit numbers.
