WEDNESDAY 10.40pm BBC1: ANDREW TATE: THE MAN WHO GROOMED THE WORLD

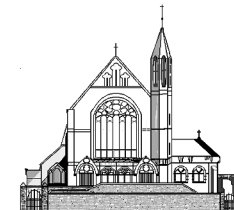
Documentary revealing the activities of Tate, a former kickboxer, who rose to fame on social media before facing rape and human trafficking charges, and how he was able to influence so many young people.
