


Moral development

Pupils are taught to combat prejudice and develop tolerance by developing an understanding of how others live. We discover how to dispel stereotypes and myths about other cultures and how we respect other cultures and their diversity. We explore issues in a global society and the equality of education across the world. We explore international projects such as Refugee Week and how we should learn many languages in order to communicate effectively.



Spiritual development

Pupils will show respect for other cultures and their values. The pupils are educated on the religious beliefs of the people in the Spanish speaking countries and how this is similar to our beliefs and how we value language as communication. This gives the pupils opportunity to consider 'identity' and what it means to them. We look at the mixture of languages we speak in our class context and how proud we are of our heritage.
