Social development

Children are developing their social skills whilst working as part of a team investigating scientific questions. They are able to collaborate to pose a question and find a solution by working scientifically. The pupils work together following the British Values of mutual respect and democracy to make decisions together when evaluating the effectiveness of circuits, materials, chemical reactions and how much force is necessary to move an object.



Moral development

Moral development is the way in which pupils challenge their world. They understand the difference between right and wrong when we are exploring animals including humans, living things and their habitats, Earth and Space and Evolution and Inheritance. Pupils are able to ask the questions of whether it is appropriate for animals to be in Zoos or should they be in their natural habitats? The pupils learn to give reasoned, informed views about ethical issues and they can appreciate the viewpoint of others and why the exploration may be necessary.
