British and Gospel Values

The Social, Spiritual, Moral and Cultural Development of pupils is important to us and one way in which we foster this is by promoting our 'Gospel Values' alongside our British Values. Our policies, procedures and daily teaching are underpinned by these values. Our weekly newsletter provides some examples of how we teach through these values and below are some examples from each class.

Nursery

Individual Liberty/Faithfulness & Integrity: We decided upon class rules for how to care for and handle the chicks. We discussed why rules are important and how we use rules to keep ourselves and others safe. It was important that we followed the rules so as the chicks were kept safe in our classroom

Reception

* Caring: This term's Gospel value is caring. Reception are really good at following the gospel values every day. Caring for our classroom and one another is very important to us all. We have welcomed two new children to our class by making them feel cared for and special.

Year 1

* British and Gospel Values. In Year 1 we have made a great start to this new half-term. We all have special jobs in class so that we can look after our classroom and care for everyone in it. If we see that someone needs help, we are all showing real kindness to each other. Well done everyone!

Year 2

* British and Gospel Values Democracy and Equality in Year 2. This week we have been welcoming a wonderful new member to our class. All of the children have been showing the kindness and caring behaviour of our School Family, making sure that we can make new friends and include everyone in all we do to make everyone feel welcome.

Year 3

* British and Gospel Values The Rule of Law: Laws form an important part of our society underpinning our Human Rights. Laws are consistently reinforced through our class rules. We understand that everyone has rights and responsibilities and should behave appropriately

Year 4

* British and Gospel Values- The Rule of Law: During our new RE topic 'Community' we have been thinking about a code of conduct. We listened to how Jesus chose his apostles and thought about ways in which we can try to follow in their footsteps. We shared examples such as being caring and giving our best effort in work and play.

Year 5

* British and Gospel Values Hope: We have just begun our topic of Hope, which is all about Advent and Christmas. At this time of the year, it is very easy to become swept up thinking about presents and Christmas dinners, but as a class we're looking at the real meaning of Christmas and how it is a time of great Hope. Advent is a time of waiting in Hope, but it is also a time to explore some of our other British and Gospel Values, such as forgiveness, generosity and respect.

Year 6

* British and Gospel Values Democracy: The school council have asked for our views on how to make our school even better and we also helped to vote for our Christmas card competition winners! We have been talking about 'All different, All Equal' during anti-bullying week. Galatians 3:28 'You are all one in Jesus Christ'
