CLASS OF THE WEEK—

NURSERY

This half term, we have implemented a vote system for choosing a story. The children arrive at nursery and have to vote for which story they would like to hear at the end of the nursery day.

We have implemented this for the children to feel that they have a choice and are confident to decide.

Mutual respect to one another:

We spoke about how we are all different but how we all should respect one another. We spoke about how we say, 'please' when we want something and 'thank you' when someone helps us or gives us something.

Nursery theme - 'Come Outside'

We have been reading 'Jaspers Beanstalk 'and spoke about what plants need to grow as well as seeds take time to grow. We planted sunflower seeds and have been observing and talking about the changes daily.

We have started to look at the story 'The Enormous Turnip'. The children were amazed at what a turnip looked liked and we spoke about what it looked like, how it felt and what it smelt like.

We have been talking about spring and what changes we have noticed outside and what clothes we have been wearing.

RE has been about 'Growing'. We spoke about Lent and what Lent means to Christians as a time to grow in love.


In Maths we have been looking at height - taller/shorter using a beanstalk which links to the theme.
