CLASS OF THE WEEK

YEAR 5 Friendship week

This week, year 5 have been involved in Friendship Week. We have had 'Odd socks day', and have been focusing on the difference between disagreements and bullying. We've talked about the differences, acted this out, and created posters for school to show the difference to the rest of the children. We have thought about how our actions impact others and how to always show kindness.

Our World:

Year 5 have been exploring the Anglo-Saxon period and what the life of the Anglo-Saxons was like. We have visited the World Museum and handled artefacts from the Anglo-Saxon period. We discussed what this tells us about life in this era. We looked at the materials that the Anglo-Saxons used in their crafts, handled weapons, and many other things.

English:

In English we are learning about one of the oldest myths and legends; Beowulf. Even though we do not know who wrote the ancient epic, we've been exploring the characters of Beowulf and Grendel. We've learnt about how the story was once a long poem that for a many years it would be told around campfires and feasting halls.

Children have also begun to create their own heroes and villains for our own myths and legends that we are creating.

Father FitzGerald visit.

This week, Father Fitz had a discussion with us about waiting for the special time of year coming up; Advent. We discussed what waiting was like, and some stories of others waiting - such as the Prophet Isiah. We now know that waiting can affect our emotions and ideas. In addition, Father Fitz discussed the Feast of Christ the King, and gospel from this Sunday. We have also started our topic on Advent, and learnt about how Advent is different to other times of years in the Catholic Church, and is a time of waiting in hope for the coming of Jesus.
