


The Beatitudes - Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for Righteousness. Matthew 5: 1 - 12








During the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus 'gave' us the Beatitudes.



Matthew 5:1-12 The Beatitudes When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying:



Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.

Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

The fourth beatitude tells us...

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied."



To 'be righteous' means to be...






Which picture d you think best shows ways of 'being righteous'? Take a moment to think...




Mission
