

Geography:

The children will explore the human and physical attributes of mountains in the United Kingdom and contrast this with mountains in a European country.

History:

The children will explore WW2 and the impact it had on Liverpool. At the end of the topic, the children will be creating their own information text to display their learning.

Music:

We will be listening to I'll be there by the Jackson Five and a piece called classroom Jazz, learning the words and looking to add accompaniment.

Art/Design Technology:

The children will be creating their own electronic car in D.T. In Autumn 2, the children will be studying the work of Thomas Schaller and create their own watercolour paintings.

Prevent Duty:

Throughout a range of subjects and topics this term, we will be looking at values, challenging views, stereotyping, individual liberty, contributing positively, making choices, mutual respecting, equality and community.

Homework:

The children will receive a piece of English and a piece of Maths homework each week. The children may also have additional homework related to topic, and are expected to read at least 4 times per week.

Year 6 Work for Autumn Term

RE:

We are beginning the year with the topic of Loving, where we will look at the different ways Jesus showed love for his people. After this we will spend a week looking at Judaism as part of our work on other faiths. We will follow this with Vocation and Commitment before leading up to Christmas with the topic of Expectations.

RSE (Relationships and Sex Education):

As part of our learning we will be focusing on the following themes, which link to our 'Come and See' topics throughout the year: *know they are created to live in our society and the wider world; know they are created to love others; and know they are Created & Loved by God*

Gospel and British Values:

Democracy, The rule of law, Individual liberty, Mutual respect and Tolerance of those of different faiths and beliefs: These are our British values and we promote these in school in a variety of ways. One way this term where we will explore these is through voting for our class representatives on the School Council.

English:

In the first half term we will begin by reading 'Star of Fear, Star of Hope, where we will look to develop our story writing skills and learn how to write a flashback.

After half term, we will use the book 'Can we save the tiger? We will look at creating an information text.

Maths:

In maths, we will begin by looking at the number system, first working with number and place value before then developing our skills with addition and subtraction. We will also develop our addition and subtraction skills.

After half term, we will look again at the number system by looking at multiplication and division, including solving problems. We will also develop our understanding of decimals, fractions and percentages, including adding and subtracting them.

Science:

The children will conduct experiments and investigations within a physics unit: electricity. After half term we will be learning about evolution and inheritance.

MFL (Modern Foreign Languages):

This term the children will be developing our knowledge of Spanish; looking at our self, friends and family members.

PE:

We will begin the year by attending swimming lessons every Tuesday.

Computing:

The children will begin the year by improving their knowledge and understanding programming and debugging. After half term, the children will look at creating digital content through a range of different mediums.
